With a 103% increase in work-at-home positions since 2005,<sup>2</sup> scenarios like the above are far too common. Working together isn't truly collaborative when stakeholders' comments, feedback, and ideas are segmented. Not only does it waste time, it results in endless versioning. End-users are left searching for the most up-to-date document in a sea of "\_v3\_final\_FINAL" files, and IT struggles to increase a business' storage capacity to accommodate the growing mass.


Fortunately, cloud storage can help end versioning without wiping edit history. Instead of heading straight for the "Save As" button, consider co-authoring a file in real time with OneDrive for Business.
